FCCO's Annual Report for our fiscal year, October 1, 2019, to September 30, 2020, is included with this newsletter. You can also find it at feralcats.com/about.

Given the eight-week hiatus in clinics and necessary safety changes due to Covid-19, we are very excited that we were still able to help so many cats. We hope you enjoy the report and see what a difference we are making together – for our communities and for the cats!



An Outpouring of Gratitude

What a compassionate and generous community we have, filled with a sincere commitment to helping cats and the people who love them. This kindness has been especially heartwarming this past year.

We worried about the pandemic's impact on raising much-needed funds. Ralph and Sandi Miller generously stepped up with a Challenge Match to inspire people to give. Then Western Partitions, Inc. (WPI) followed with another \$20,000 match. Purrs of thanks for all the donations we received – 612 donors contributed to make sure we fully met both of these challenges.

We also received 2,208 pounds of food for our Season's Feedings cat food drive to help provide nutritious meals for feral cats this winter. Many thanks to all the individuals and the following stores that donated and collected food: Happy Tails, Healthy Pet - Lake Oswego, Healthy Pets NW, ROAR, and Sellwood Pet Supply.

Last but far from least, we are grateful to FCCO Board members Karen and Cliff Deveney, and Shawn Mangum (and his wife Lisa!) for donating



funds for FCCO to design and install a protective awning on the building. The building is closed to the public during the pandemic so we are doing outdoor check-in and check-out of cats and traps. We needed a way to protect people and cats from the outdoor elements and the awning is making a big difference.

President's Corner

A Few Final Words

This is my farewell column, as I am stepping down as President of the FCCO Board of Directors after many years, though I will remain on the Board as a member.

FCCO has changed so much since I began volunteering as a surgeon in 2001 and subsequently joined the Board. I have been honored to play a role helping Executive Director Karen Kraus and Medical Director Leah Kennon, both of whom have been at the helm since I have been involved, with growing FCCO into what it is today. I see more and more cats and their caregivers receiving help every year. This has included expansion from the mobile surgery vehicle, holding clinics once monthly hosted at various locations, to a leased free-standing clinic, and now to our own building where surgery is offered up to four days a week. The clinic structure has also evolved from mostly all volunteers to paid staff, including technicians and contract veterinarians. These transitions all led to better care for the cats, with more efficiency and capacity, and greater safety.

I am also proud to see how the Board has evolved, from only veterinarians at



FCCO's inception to adding members with varied skills and backgrounds that have been helpful in the growth of our organization.

While 2020 proved challenging, we have found the strength and resilience to overcome many barriers, and I can't say enough how much is owed to the staff for leading the way. I have also been extremely grateful to our FCCO community who stepped up to help keep FCCO afloat, to be able to resume our services which are needed now even more since the Covid-19 shutdown. The Board's prior strategic plans pretty much went out the window when the pandemic occurred, so there will be a fresh perspective with the new year, and into the future. There is much for us to take from the efforts of the past year as we move forward. Thank you for being there with me on this journey!

Vice President Nena Baker became Board President this month. I would like to thank two members who are stepping down from the Board: John Maddigan and Sarah Moses – we appreciate your service to FCCO.

It took five months after this stray kitty wandered into our lives for Murphy to trust us enough to let us pet him. For all those months he would be sitting by the back porch starting at 7am, then returning three to four times during the day. We fed him each time and would talk with him, too. Finally, in September 2019, he came in the house and we brought him to FCCO to be neutered and vaccinated a few months later.

Murphy still won't use the litter box and seems to prefer to go outside. He is so good about it, though, and when we think it's time for him to come back in after about a half hour all we do is call and he comes. We do everything we can to keep this boy safe!
